MONDAY, JUNE 8, 2015

On Monday, the rookies were quickly ushered into the Action Sports Center due to rain in order to begin the Opening Ceremony, though the weather did not seem to interfere with our fun! During this time, Masters of Ceremony Chris Aarone and Marge Murphy headed an exciting opening rally! The children were pumped as Chris taught them the CI-REDS chant:

Officers from the Dayton Police
Department taught the rookies how to
cooperate by demonstrating how they interact
with the K-9 dog unit. Children watched as
officers and dogs cooperated with each other by
following commands and working together.

listened and obeyed commanding officers. There
were many questions about how they get the
dogs to listen so well, and the officers
emphasized how important it was to cooperate
with them on a daily basis in order to teach
them how to operate within the unit.

Sensei Sukh Sandhu and his team taught the children cooperation by displaying their great discipline with one another, and by teaching the teams actual Jiu Jitsu moves! The martial artists worked together as they demonstrated different fighting situations, and showed how important it is to cooperate in order to not injure one another. Sensei Sukh Sandhu explained carefully to the children that without cooperation, we cannot succeed in life.

The children truly enjoyed the guidance of their mentors, and have already begun demonstrating their "Stars of Success" by cooperating well with each other through out


